# Thank You!

I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy... Philippians 1:3-4 ESV



As I thought about November and the national Thanksgiving holiday, a memory of an old television sitcom came to mind. Throughout the 1980s, a series called "Newhart" aired on the CBS network. Starring comedian Bob Newhart as the main character, the series recounted the misadventures of this character, who, though he was an author, somehow ended up as an innkeeper at a small hotel in Vermont. As a child, the show's humor didn't speak to me, but I mostly remember how the main character was frequently bothered by three men who were brothers. Two of them never spoke, but the one brother always introduced himself in the following way: "I'm Larry. This is my brother Darryl. This is my other brother Darryl." Now that I am grown, I can see why many found the show funny.

One episode of this show came to mind as November, the month of Thanksgiving, approached. The details are sketchy in my mind, but I remember that Bob Newhart's character received some kind of community award. Because he was afraid of leaving someone out, he decided simply to say a general "thank you" to everyone at the podium rather than listing off the people who had helped him along the way.

But as time went on, the character felt an overwhelming sense of guilt that he didn't take the time to thank specifically everyone who deserved it. The episode ended with Bob Newhart's character standing at the same podium in the late hours of the night, struggling to remember everyone who helped him, even in some trivial way.

Our human sinful tendency is to focus on the negative, and that is part of the reason that Thanksgiving as a holiday is important. There is no end to things in this world that could be and should be different. But sometimes that reality keeps us from living in thanksgiving for the abundance we have right now, all of which stems from God's grace. God has indeed given us much at different times of life: health, family, friends, shelter, clothing, food, and life itself, just to name a few key things. Martin Luther referred to these things as "daily bread" in his Small Catechism. And God has also given us faith and salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.

One thing I am thankful for this month and throughout the year is this church. We have a great congregation here at Grace Lutheran that consists of many great people. So, like Bob Newhart's character, I want to take the opportunity to say "thank you." The following might be more amusing for you if you imagine me like Bob Newhart, standing at a podium in the wee hours of the morning:

### VIOLENT ATTACKER RESPONSE

**RUN** – Get <u>away</u> from the area as fast as you can. If you can run, run in a zig-zag manner. Take your children and any mobility-impaired person with you. Leave all your belongings behind. Get as far away as you can. Get out of the building if possible. THEN, call 911.

**HIDE** – Do NOT try to hide under a pew as that makes you an easy target. Try to get into a different room with a door. Once inside, lock or block the door with whatever you can – furniture, books, anything. Stay away from windows. Turn off lights. Remain silent. Do not talk to others. Use hand signals. Silence your cell phone. Send texts only, if at all possible.

**FIGHT** – <u>As a last resort</u>, if you cannot get away or hide and have to fight, throw as hard as you can ANYTHING at the attacker. This includes purses, cell phones, hymnals, Bibles, fire extinguishers, coffee cups – ANYTHING. Aim them directly at the attacker's head or groin. If you must, run TOWARDS the attacker as fast as you can. Grab and HANG ON to the attacker if possible. Keep your body held tightly against that person. This will distract the attacker and potentially allow others to disarm and disable the attacker.

**WHEN POLICE ARRIVE** -- Try to stay calm. Raise your arms and show your open hands to the police. Do NOT run towards the police. Wait for and follow their instructions. Do not leave the area until instructed to do so by the police.

SHARP EYES NEEDED! - You may have noticed that labels have recently been placed on the outlet and switch cover plates throughout the building. This is part of the creation of an "electrical map" of the entire building, inside and out, so that it will be easy to track down electrical problems in the future. If you spot a cover plate anywhere in the building that is NOT labeled, please let Bob Reynolds know. Contact him personally, text 630-698-0457 or email bobr22600@twc.com. Let not a single cover plate escape this task!
