"Do the Little That You Can!"

Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it.

Proverbs 3:27 ESV (Monthly Watchword for May 2023)



During this year's season of Lent, I enjoyed talking during Wednesday evening worship about the petitions of the Lord's Prayer in conjunction with the various hymns of a Swedish Lutheran woman named Lina Sandell (full name: Carolina Wilhelmina Sandell-Berg). The daughter of a Lutheran pastor in Sweden, she lived between 1832 and 1903. During her life, she wrote approximately 600 hymns, leading many to label her "the Fanny Crosby of Sweden." In the English-speaking world, her most famous hymns are "Children of the Heavenly Father," "Day by Day," and "Thy Holy Wings." All these and more have been a great strength to me personally. They are warm, sweet expressions of faith. Though the texts are simple, they are filled with biblical concepts and images. One must know the Bible well to pick up on all of them.

When I think of the many spiritual influences in my life, Lina Sandell ranks high on my list. Unfortunately, only a tiny fraction of her hymns have been translated into English for us to enjoy. But as I thought about the Watchword for this month of May, I call to mind one of her hymns that as of yet remains only in Swedish: *Gör det lilla du kan* (Literally: "Do the little that you can"). It is based on the words of Jesus from Matthew 25:40. In response to the righteous, who served those in need, Jesus says, "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me." These people did little things that might not seem so significant: giving the hungry food, giving the thirsty a drink, welcoming a stranger, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and the prisoners. In *Gör det lilla du kan*, Lina Sandell encourages people to go about their lives remembering that in the process of serving others, we are really serving God.

One of the great contributions of the Lutheran tradition to the broader Christian world is its emphasis on what we call vocation. In what we sometimes call "the priesthood of all believers," Martin Luther taught that the "religious" calling of the pastor does not place the pastor on a higher spiritual level than laypeople. True, the pastor's call is distinct and important, but he wanted all Christians to realize that together we share in a common priesthood as the body of Christ: *But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.* (1 Peter 2:9 ESV).

We are all called to be priests in service to God in our own stations in life, in our families, professionally, and as volunteers, and God can and does use us in many and various vocations in life. God has blessed us in many and different ways, but as Peter reminds us in the verse quoted above, those blessings are given for a purpose: to give glory to God and help to our fellow humans, even in small ways. The Watchword for May from Proverbs 3:27 prods us to share good with "those to whom it is due."

To whom is good due? Sometimes our daily tasks seem like a burden. Sometimes the help we offer others seems to go unappreciated. Sometimes we wonder what impact our lives actually make. Sometimes we wonder what we have to contribute. As thankless as our service can seem, good is due to everyone simply by virtue of the fact that God loves His creation and the people of the world. The events leading up to Easter remind us that God has not held anything back in showing his love to us. All around us we see great need in those who are lonely, afflicted, and in other types of distress, and such people are also the objects of God's love.

"Do the little that you can." A little can go a long way. While it is important to be wise and discerning in *how* we serve others (avoiding enabling rather than genuine helping), God gives us many opportunities to share His love. The people I remember most in my own life are those who treated me kindly in challenging times, and they most likely did not realize the effect they had on me.

As priests in service to God, we show forth the power of Jesus' death and resurrection not usually by miracles or mighty acts of heroism, but rather by looking at those around us with the eyes of our Savior, with eyes of love and compassion. How is God currently working through you? How is God calling you to do the little that you can?

1. Opening Prayer: Devotion and prayer was given by Pastor Tom. 2. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order by Vice President Matt Sheridan.

- 3. Pastor's Report
- · Lent, Holy Week, Easter Sunday all went well o Attendance similar to last year
- Five baptisms on Easter Vigil
 - o One adult, four children between ages 4-10 (not all from same family)
- · Men's breakfast continuing
 - o Third Saturday at Nana's and Papa's in Thornport
 - o Fellowship and brief devotion/Bible study
- Last confirmation class for the year will be April 23rd
 - o Will resume with two new units next year, with the addition of new eighth grade students
- New member recognition
 - o Discussed with council as to what has been done in the past.
 - o Suggestions were to have a cake and pictures taken to put in the monthly Gracevine and maybe displayed in the Gathering Space. This would be done yearly.
 - o Tentative date June 4th, which is also Graduation Sunday.
- Will be doing Adopt a Highway cleanup at the end of month connected with youth lock in
 - o Signs have been put up
- Have started writing script for introductory video of congregation o Will have a draft by next month
- Tree planting
 - o A Royal Raindrops Crabapple Tree from Albyn's nursery

will be planted soon at the parsonage, to replace the three dead crabapple trees that were cut down.

- o A motion was made by Carl and seconded by Linda to have Albyn plant the crabapple tree for \$100 with a two-year guarantee. Motion was passed.
- NALC Convocation August 7-11 in Oklahoma City
 - o Bob Reynolds and Carl Lahman have offered to be our delegates if no one else wants to attend. Both have attended convocations in the past.
 - o If more than two wants to attend, council will vote to appoint two delegates.
- Also need people to register and attend the NALC Ohio Mission Region Convocation May 5-6
 - o I will be leading a session with Jeff Morlock entitled "The Call to Pastoral Ministry."
- Continuing to serve as the NALC dean for SE Ohio District
 - o Pr. Scott Smith from St. Matthew's Lutheran in Logan is leaving for a church in Illinois, leaving me the sole dean for the district (at least for the moment)
- Have been officially appointed to the NALC Commission on Theology and Doctrine
 - o Will meet in Pittsburgh May 1-2
- 4. Inreach Ministry Linda Keaser (Inreach Ministry Team Coordinator)
- WNALC
 - Tickets are available for the Women's Spring Luncheon on May 20. Congregation response to the NALC Disaster Team collection of kitchen items as well as blankets and quilts has been well received and continues.
- KFC/KFROGS
 - o Thanks go to the youth and their parents for providing Easter Breakfast. Donations received go to the Perry County Animal Shelter and to the Military Ministry at Grace.
 - o A lock-in is planned for KFROGS and KFC youth for April 29-30 at the church.
- Adventures in Faith (AIF)
 - o Pastor Theresa Jacobson, our Sunday school coordinator has posted the schedule for Sunday School PS-12th

grades. The last day for class is May 28th. Community Vacation Bible School is June 12-16 at Grace. Sunday school will resume on Rally Day, August 20.

- Graduation Sunday
 - o Graduation Sunday is planned for June 4th. High school, college, technical school graduates for 2023 need to contact the church office with their information.
- Paul Varner Scholarship Fund:

o Beth Raab has agreed to coordinate applications for this tuition aid fund which are disbursed in the fall.

- 5. Outreach Ministry Vicki Jones (Outreach Coordinator)
- Lenten soup suppers
 - Average weekly attendance at Lenten soup suppers was 60. Wanda Hupp oversaw sign-ups for soups and desserts. (I think she did a fabulous job)! She mentioned that it was a lot for one person to coordinate and thought we would benefit from more than one coordinator in the future.
- Manna Monday
 - Manna Monday restarted on April 17 (27 attended).
 Donations of desserts are often needed and volunteers are always appreciated!
- Thornville Food Pantry
 - Visited the Thornville Food Pantry and spoke with coordinator, Julia Cooperrider. Currently the food pantry is assisting 28-30 families per month. Donations of non-perishable food items and monetary support are always welcome.
- 6. Upreach Ministry Casey Sigler (Upreach Coordinator)
- New Paschal Candle
 - o New Paschal Candle arrived and was used during Lenten Services
- Greeters, Lectors and Acolytes
 - o Continue to look for volunteers for Greeters, Lectors and Acolytes
- Sound System
 - o Looking for volunteers to learn and run live stream and

sound system for 8:00 and 10:30 services. Pastor has been in contact with someone that is interested.

- 7. Treasurer's Report Rick Rockwell (Treasurer)
- Reports were distributed and discussed.
- The Consolidated Fund Activity Report, in the monthly Gracevine, now shows a bar chart that compares actual giving-to-date to budgeted giving-to-date, as well as other giving-to-date that is not part of the budget.
- Giving is \$20,000 below what we have budgeted (or planned) for the year-to-date, as of end of March.
- 8. Facilities Report Carl Lahman (Facilities Coordinator)
- Steam cleaning
 - o On March 30th, Nice & Clean Chem-Dry steam cleaned the carpet in the Gathering Space/hallway and church office, plus the pew cushions in the sanctuary.
- Furnace repairs
 - On March 31st Performance Heating & Cooling replaced the 2" air flow pipes and exhaust pipes with 3" PVC pipes on one of the dual furnaces in the basement. They also rerouted the pipes that required boring holes in masonry. As a result, the dual furnace is finally working properly. This was a major project that corrected a long-time problem.
 - o On April 7th, Fairfield Heating & Cooling replaced an inducer motor on another furnace in the basement that services the Fellowship Hall. Was lucky to get it done before Easter.
- Lawn Care
 - o Negotiated with PC Lawn Care to get a lawn care service contract with terms and conditions.
 - o Thanks to John Ulmer for fertilizing the church's lawn with step 1 of a 4-step program. Also, thanks to Gene Raab for treating the dandelions at the parsonage.
- Spring-Cleaning
 - o On April 1st, we had our annual Spring-Cleaning Day. At last count, 20 people worked that day. New bookcase and chair for the cry room/nursery were assembled. Many thanks to all

those who worked that day. We got a lot done.

- Bookcase
 - Fixed the bookcase that is in the Gathering Space. One of the bolts was missing and a new hole had to be drilled. Thank you, Bob Reynolds.
- Light bulbs
 - o Dave Rodenbaugh and Bob Reynolds finished replacing bulbs throughout the entire building.
- Electrical repairs
 - Dave Rodenbaugh (with the help of Bob Reynolds) replaced an A/C whip on the southwest side. [A whip is a conduit that connects the compressor to the disconnect box.] They also replaced both exterior outlets on the west side entrance, with ground fault breakers and waterproof outlet covers.
- Tree trimming/removal
 - o Once school is out, Broken Limb Tree Service will be trimming and removing some trees at both parsonage and church (mostly parsonage).
- Washer/dryer
 - A request has been made to purchase a washer/dryer. Currently, we are exploring the feasibility of doing this. The location would be the closet where the sump pump is located, off Noah's Club. Council felt it was a good idea, but would like to see the cost of purchasing and cost of installation (plumbing and electrical) before making a final decision.
- Library
 - o Repainted the library room, located off the Gathering Space.
 - o Karen Lewis has organized a group of volunteers on May 1st to finish organizing the books in the library.
 - o Plans are to put a small table and some comfortable chairs in the library.
- Quilt Closet
 - Currently this closet is used by many people and ministries.
 Plans are being made to contact those who use this closet and see if we get a group of volunteers to clean and reorganize this closet.

- Door lock on the southwest entrance
 - There is a lock problem with the double metal door that leads into the Fellowship Hall. Hopefully we can find a local locksmith that can fix the problem. Other door locks will need to be inspected in the future. In the meantime, when possible, use a key to unlock and lock the door from the outside to avoid problems.

Anna O. ordered name tags to be used for the luncheon


The women will meet on **Friday**, **May 19th at 1:00 p.m.** to decorate the fellowship hall.





Rich is helping implementing a new payroll system and prepare accounting reports that will be helpful in their upcoming branch meeting.

Rainy season has began and the cooler temps are slowly making their way here. We are so thankful for this. Pray that the country is able to grow all the food that they need and then some. The prices for basic foods have skyrocketed, making it very hard for those living on an average wage of \$2-5 a day. (Our only complaint is that this rainy season has been the leaking roofs at the PBT property. There is a family living in one of those properties and the damage to their home has been extensive and we are having to consider putting on a new roof or raising the pitch of the roof...both will need to be done after the rains have stopped. Meanwhile, their ceiling continue to leak...the whole length of their home.)
