#### The Ten Commandments: The Third Commandment

"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy."

#### Exodus 20:8 ESV



#### In this third of the Ten

Commandments, we hear the odd sounding word "Sabbath." What does it mean? In the Hebrew language, it simply means "rest." Among the Israelite people in the Old Testament, this commandment had a specific meaning. God commanded them to rest from their work on the seventh day of the week. This was not just some pointless regulation. Taking time to rest is an important part of the rhythm of life. It was meant as a constant reminder of what is truly important in life. Our daily work certainly is important, but it should not cause us to neglect other important parts of life: family and of course God, the one from whom all blessings flow. In the Bible, this Sabbath day was observed from sundown on Friday to sundown on Saturday. (Note that the Sabbath day in the Bible is not Sunday!) To this day, Jewish people observe the Sabbath at this time. They gather with their families for rest, fellowship, and worship of God.

Like other laws and regulations that God commanded the Israelite people in the Old Testament, Christians have generally understood that they are not bound by the regulation to observe the Sabbath day as outlined in the Old Testament. But this does not mean that this Third Commandment is irrelevant. It had a particular meaning for the Israelite people, but it has a more universal meaning that does apply to Christian people. For Christians, there is no single particular day on which we must worship publicly. Many people have come to believe that "Sabbath" refers to Sunday, but that is not correct. Over time, Sunday, the first day of the week, came to be associated with Christian worship, and hence a day of rest. This is partly because Sunday was the day of Jesus' resurrection from the dead. But Lutherans have always understood that there is no particular day that is mandated for Christian worship. If a congregation chooses to designate Sunday as its time for public worship, that is fine, and there is good symbolism behind Sunday worship, being rooted in Jesus' resurrection. But when to worship remains a congregation's free choice. It is perfectly acceptable for a congregation to choose another day on which to gather, and there are places where that is the case, which hold worship on Saturdays or Wednesdays, for example.


Whatever the case, we Christians are in need of Sabbath. What does that mean for us? In the *Small Catechism*, Martin Luther simply explained it in this way:

We should fear and love God so that we do not despise his Word and the preaching of it, but acknowledge it as holy, and gladly hear and learn it.

God knows that as we live our lives on this earth, we need to be refreshed and renewed, both physically and spiritually. And so the Sabbath is not some pointless regulation we need to follow, but instead is a blessed gift. In his *Large Catechism*, Martin Luther explained that we need Sabbath for "bodily need." But more importantly, Sabbath exists "so that people may have time and opportunity, which otherwise would not be available, to participate in public worship, that is, that they may assemble to hear and discuss God's Word and then praise God with song and prayer." This command not to neglect the hearing of God's Word is meant as a gift to us, as it is through that Word that we are constantly reminded of who we are. And God desires to renew us through his good news in Jesus Christ. It is tempting to let other voices drown out the voice of God. But Jesus keeps calling out to us: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-29).

#### A Word from Carl Lahman (Council President)

Being council secretary last year and council president for four months this year, I have learned a lot about how Grace Lutheran Church functions and its ministries.

One of the things I am learning more and more about is how we arrive at our budget and how many special funds we have, which are separate from the budget.

Money is one of those things that we never seem to have enough of. No matter how much we have, we can always use more. Won't it be nice when we get to heaven and we won't have to worry anymore about money? But in the meantime, we need to be good stewards of our money, just like every other gift that God has given us to manage, which reminds me of a scene from the movie "*It's A Wonderful Life*". The film stars Jimmy Stewart as George Bailey, a man who has given up his dreams and decides to end his life on Christmas Eve. But his guardian angel, Clarence, intervenes and eventually shows George all the lives he has touched and realizes what a wonderful life he has.

The scene in the movie that I want to describe is when George loses \$8,000 (actually it was Uncle Billy who lost the \$8,000, which would be worth about \$127,000 today) and a warrant is out for his arrest for bank fraud. At this point, George loses hope. So, what does George do? He gets drunk, crashes his car, and staggers to a bridge, intending to end his life. However, before he can leap, Clarence jumps in and pretends to be drowning. George rescues him and as they are drying off, Clarence reveals himself to be George's guardian angel and wants to help him. George says, "You don't happen to have 8,000 bucks on you?" Clarence smiles and says, "Oh, no, no. We don't use money in

#### heaven." George replies, "<u>Oh, that's right, I keep</u> forgetting. Comes in pretty handy down here, bub!"

So, what does this have to do with Grace and our church budget? <u>Money comes in pretty handy here at Grace too</u>! It takes money, not only for our ministries, but also our staff and this beautiful church. Wouldn't it be nice if our budget allowed us to dream about new possibilities?

I Corinthians 16:2 says: On the first day every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come, no collections will have to be made.

If we look carefully at this verse, we see that (1) offering is an act of worship, which should be done in joy (not just a duty); (2) Our giving needs to be systematic, not in urgent appeal or a financial crisis; (3) We should give in proportion to what we have earned; and (4) our giving should be planned in advance.

If God has a plan, shouldn't we? Did you know that our total Budget for 2024 is \$284,260? That means we should average \$5,460 in giving each week that goes specifically to the general budget. Did you know that for the past year, including this year, our giving has not kept up with our expenses nor our budget? This makes it difficult, for example, to keep up building maintenance and growing ministries.

Keep in mind that nobody will ever come up to you and tell you that you need to give more. That's between you and God.

On a personal note, early in my marriage to Jeni, I wasn't very smart with my spending. In fact, early on, Jeni fired me

and took over our checkbook. My point is, when planning your church giving amount, you may need to figure out who the financial person is in your family and work together to come up with a practical amount.

Faith too has a lot to do with it. When I retired, for the first few months I drove Jeni crazy with my financial spreadsheet. I wanted to account for every penny that we spent. I can tell you that over time I have learned more about being faithful. I've also learned to live within my means, follow a budget, and to be patient when I want something and when Jeni tells me "Not Now"!

In conclusion, let me close with a quote from 2 Corinthians 9:8: And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything, and may provide in abundance for every good work.

So, you see, life truly is wonderful.




