The Ten Commandments:

The Seventh Commandment You shall not steal.

If it is not already clear from these monthly newsletter articles about the Ten Commandments, our relationship with God is something that goes beyond Sunday morning



worship. That time in worship is important, as we have seen. However, our whole being is meant to express the love, mercy, and grace that we have received through Jesus Christ.

And so these Ten Commandments touch on issues of everyday life and conduct. How we conduct ourselves on a day-to-day basis is not a matter of indifference in the eyes of God. This month, we get to the Seventh Commandment, which has to do with the topic of stealing. In the *Small Catechism*, Martin Luther explained it in this way:

We should fear and love God so that we do not rob our neighbors of their money or property, nor take from them by unfair dealing or fraud, but help them to improve and protect their property and means of making a living.

I suppose that most of us are not guilty of blatant robbery. But the temptation to steal is with us from a young age, when we see candy in the checkout line that we want but can't have, when we see our classmates' fancy crayons and pens in school, and when we see our friends' toys when visiting their homes. This commandment speaks to the attitude that God desires to find in us. We are called upon to respect the property of others, even when we would like to have it ourselves.

But just like the other commandments thus far, Martin Luther took the Seventh Commandment and understood it more broadly than a specific command against robbery by gunpoint. In his own day, he was aware that many people used their roles to take advantage of those near them. He called upon employees to be honest with their employers, for employers not to take advantage of those in their charge, to pay them fairly. He called upon business owners not to overcharge customers to line their own pocketbooks.


God calls us as His people to live with integrity, even in the little things of life. We have been entrusted with much, and we are ultimately accountable to God. With this commandment, God seeks to protect those in our world who are most harmed by "unfair dealing."

Luther wrote in his Large Catechism:

Let all people know, then, that it is their duty, on pain of God's displeasure, not to harm their neighbors, to take advantage of them, or to defraud them by any faithless or underhanded business transaction. Much more than that, they are also obligated faithfully to protect their neighbors' property and to promote and further their interests, especially when they get money, wages, and provisions for doing so.

CONGREGATIONS COME IN ALL SIZES AND CHALLENGES

The other day I went through an old box of church stuff and found an interesting article that I saved on congregation sizes. It made me think of the size of our church and whether we are expecting too much or too little in terms of such things as decision making authority, pastor's responsibilities, and ministry.

There are many ways to categorize church congregation sizes, especially if we were to give size in numbers. To keep it simple, let's categorize churches in terms of characteristics into small, medium, and large.

Small:

- > Members know everyone. It is like an extended family.
- > Many small churches combine resources with other churches.
- > Less funding available for staff and ministry.
- ➤ Pastors do most of the work. Many pastors are part-time and serve more than one congregation. One service on Sunday morning.

Medium:

- ➤ Moving from small to medium size, you start losing the sense of connectedness. For example, going to multiple services.
- ➤ More funds available for ministry. However, cash flow can be a problem in cases of remodeling building and paying high mortgages.
- ➤ More volunteers available for ministry. However, members must be involved so things get done.
- > Staff can be added. Pastor does not have to do all the work.

Large:

- ➤ Lots of opportunities/ministries that wouldn't be available at a smaller church. Perhaps the greatest challenge is making sure everyone feels connected.
- ➤ Multiple pastors and large staff.
- ➤ Large churches are dependent upon pastors, program staff, and top lay leaders for daily decision making.

I believe most of us would agree that Grace Lutheran is a medium size church. Pastor Tom and Pastor Theresa both have experience with small congregations and I'm sure they both have felt like the Lone Ranger (one of my favorite TV westerns growing up) and could have used a faithful sidekick like Tonto.

We at Grace are blessed to be in a position not enjoyed by many congregations, especially smaller ones. Yes, we do have challenges. Sometimes ministries have to end, leadership positions are not always filled, more volunteers are needed and funds are not always available. But despite our challenges, we can still to do a variety of ministries, hire some staff to help our congregation, and we have many small groups to foster close relationships and still have everyone know each other fairly well.

On November 3, we will have our annual congregation meeting. This will be a time to celebrate the ministries of Grace, as well as report on some goals for the next year, elect new members to council and approve a budget for 2025. Please plan to come and participate in this important meeting.

2024 NALC Online Mission Convocation Report, August 9. [Compiled from notes from attendees: Carl Lahman, Bob Reynolds, and Pastor Tom]

On Friday, August 9th from 6-9 p.m., we heard from Bishop Dan Selbo and participated in elections and voting. We also heard updates from across the NALC.

At the beginning was a very interesting devotion, given by Rev. Dr. Eric Riesen, President of the North American Lutheran Seminary. He talked about the challenges of our secular/unchurched culture and the battle between flesh vs. spirit.

The Nominating Committee presented candidates for positions to be elected on the Executive Council, Court of Adjudication and Board of Regents. Biographical information was given prior to the meeting.

- The Executive Council implements the work and policies of the NALC. This year one clergyperson and one layperson were elected.
- The Court of Adjudication has jurisdiction to decide appeals from disciplinary decisions, questions regarding interpretation of the NALC's governing documents and claims of any violations of governing documents of the NALC. This year one clergy was elected.
- The Board of Regents act as governing body of the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS). This year two clergy were elected, one being Rev. Alliyah (Greaver) Blakeley, St. John Lutheran Church, from Greenville, Ohio.

There was a report given by Rev. Amy Little on Youth & Family Safeguarding, who emphasized the importance for congregations to have a child protection policy (like the one we now have at Grace Lutheran)!

A treasurer's report and 2025 budget were presented and voted upon. Budget of \$4,415,460 passed.

It was emphasized that as we look to the future, we need to emphasize our:

- 1. **NALC Core Values**: Christ centered, mission driven, traditionally grounded and congregationally focused
- 2. **Mission Purpose**: The Great Commandment, The Great Commission and The Call to Be and to Make Disciples
- 3. **Vision**: Renew its congregations, Equip the people, and Become a disciple making body

Some miscellaneous interesting updates and challenges:

- The NALC is in its 15th year.
- There are 512 NALC congregations
- This is the 10th year of our Lutheran Seminary
- 300 youth participated in this year's Youth Gathering in Texas.
- 43 full-time pastor vacancies and 27 part-time pastor vacancies.
- Benevolence: 30% of congregations do not give to the NALC.
 The NALC is asking congregations to consider giving 5-7% of their budget to the NALC.







How we worship and why!!



As Lutherans, we come to church, we praise God, and follow our liturgy, but do you truly understand the service? During the worship there are rituals that we, as Lutherans, do.... because that's what we were taught. As Karen and I have gone from church to church and pastor to pastor, we have found that each has differences. Come join us on September 8th in the Fellowship Hall during Sunday school (9:15) for a discussion of these differences.

Dartball is a game played by throwing darts at the "Target Diamond". Where your dart lands determines what you have done while "at bat". What you are doing is playing baseball with darts.






