Save Energy! With the increase in heating and electricity bills, it is now more important than ever to do everything we can to reduce energy usage. Last year we replaced all lights with LED lights. This year we would like everyone to close doors and turn off lights when not in use, especially class rooms, sanctuary, gathering space, fellowship hall and Noah's club. Thank you for saving energy!

Fire Inspection Notice - Please note that "hold open devices" are prohibited on all fire doors. This means that we can no longer have hold open devices attached to the main entrance doors to the Gathering Space, Sanctuary, and Fellowship Hall. We are currently looking into installing magnetic hold-open devices with automatic door closers in case of a fire, which will take time. In the meantime, there are rubber door stoppers available for short-time use. However, keep in mind that these doors must stay closed when not in use. For example, after church services and other church functions.
